2012-2013 OPEN ENROLLMENT

Wisconsin's Inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend school districts other than the one in which they live.

Students in 5-year-old kindergarten to grade 12 may apply to participate in open enrollment. Open enrollment for prekindergarten, 4-year-old kindergarten and early childhood education is limited. Parents should call their resident school districts to find out if their preschool-aged children qualify for open enrollment.

Parents must submit application forms to the non-resident district during the enrollment time which has been extended by the Governor. **For the 2012-2013 school year, parents must apply no earlier than February 6, 2012 and no later than April 30, 2012 at 4:00 p.m. Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.**

Application forms can be obtained from the West Allis-West Milwaukee District Administration Building located at 1205 S. 70th Street after January 2, 2012, and must be delivered (hand-delivery is recommended) to the nonresident school district during the application period. If you have any questions or would like an Open Enrollment Brochure, please contact Lincoln School Office.

You can also go to our district homepage, click on Open Enrollment Information on the left column of the page there is a link to the DPI website where you can do an online application beginning Feb. 6th.

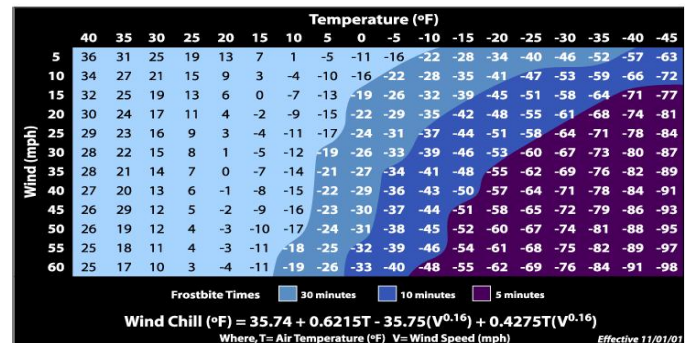

Wind Chill Chart



The Wind Chill index is the temperature your body feels when the air temperature is combined with the wind speed. It is based on the rate of heat loss from exposed skin caused by the effects of wind and cold. As the speed of the wind increases, it can carry heat away from your body much more quickly, causing skin temperature to drop and hypothermia to come on quickly. When there are high winds, serious weather-related health problems are more likely, even when temperatures are only cool.

The Wind Chill Chart above shows the difference between actual air temperature and perceived temperature, and amount of time until frostbite occurs.
