In-Coming 4K Students	
Where do new 4K students attend school next year?	<p>For the next two years, priority of placement would be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sibling school. • If there is no sibling, the neighborhood school. <p>Beginning in 2018-2019, students attend their neighborhood school.</p>
Current 4K Students Transitioning to 5K	
Where do new students (that did not attend 4K in WAWM) attend 5K next year?	<p>For the next two years, priority of placement would be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sibling school. • If there is no sibling, the neighborhood school. <p>Beginning in 2018-2019, students attend their neighborhood school.</p>
Where do 4K students that attended a Center this year go to school for 5K next year?	<p>For the 2016-2017 school year, priority of placement would be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sibling school. • If there is no sibling, the neighborhood school.
Where do 4K students who had a one year Intra-District Transfer to a non-attendance area school attend 5K next year?	<p>For the next two years, priority of placement would be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sibling school. • If there is no sibling, the neighborhood school. <p>Beginning in 2018-2019, students attend their neighborhood school.</p>
Where do 4K students who were assigned to a non-attendance area Elementary school attend 5K next year?	<p>These students have the option to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Remain at current school. • Sibling school. • Neighborhood school. <p>Beginning in 2018-2019, students attend their neighborhood school.</p>

Students Currently Enrolled at a School	
Where do students currently attending an Elementary, Intermediate or High school attend next year?	Students may continue in their current school or attend their neighborhood school until they transition to the Intermediate or High school (after which they will attend their neighborhood school).
Siblings	
Will elementary siblings be separated?	For the next two years, students have the option to attend school with their sibling. Beginning in 2018-2019, new elementary students will attend their neighborhood school.
Will intermediate siblings be separated?	Students who are transitioning to Intermediate school and have a sibling who is attending an Intermediate school that is outside of the attendance area can attend that school with their sibling.
Will high school siblings be separated?	Students who are transitioning to a High school and have a sibling who is attending a High school that is outside of the attendance area can attend that school with their sibling.
Students that move to a new WAWM residence during the school year	
Where does a student that moves to a new residence within the WAWM District during the school year attend next year?	The student can attend the neighborhood school or finish the year in their current school after which the student will attend the neighborhood school.
What if a junior in High school moves to a new residence within the WAWM District during the school year?	The student will be allowed to remain at the High school through senior year.
Intra-District Transfer	
What are the reasons for intra-district transfer?	<p>Beginning in the 2016-2017 school year, Intra-District transfers must be approved by both the sending school and receiving school. The transfer request is to originate with the school the student currently attends. Once approved, this becomes the student's school until the student transitions to a new grade level (Intermediate or High School).</p> <p>The reasons for intra-district transfer are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Response to legal documentation (e.g., restraint/custody order documentation is required). • Response to medical documentation (e.g., doctor documentation is required). • As part of an official resolution involving a formal complaint over a dispute (e.g., district documentation is required).

<p>What if the District places a student in a non-attendance area school because the neighborhood school is full?</p>	<p>If student placement results in a student being assigned to a school other than the neighborhood school (e.g., capacity or the reasons listed above) the assigned school will work to honor any request for siblings to attend that school.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If openings at the neighborhood school become available, the student that was displaced will have a choice to return. • Siblings of the displaced students will have an opportunity to return to the neighborhood school if space is available.

Implementation Plan

- Implementation begins for the 2016-2017 school year.
- Students new to the WAWM District or transitioning to a new grade level (Elementary, Intermediate or High School) would attend their neighborhood school.
- Elementary students currently enrolled at an elementary building (excluding 4K students who received a one-year intra-district transfer approval) would have the opportunity to continue in the current building or choose to attend their neighborhood school.
- Intermediate and High School students currently enrolled in an intermediate or high school can continue in the current building until they transition to the next school level after which they would attend their neighborhood school.
- For the next two years, students who have a sibling that is attending a building outside of the attendance area can attend that same school with their sibling.
- Beginning in year 2018-2019, only students transitioning to a secondary grade level (Intermediate or High School) and have a sibling who is attending a building that is outside of the attendance area could choose to attend that same school with their sibling.
- Students that move to a new residence (in the WAWM District) during the school year, could attend the neighborhood school or finish the year in their current school after which the student would attend the neighborhood school. If the student was a junior in High School, that student would be allowed to remain through senior year.
