

STUDENT SURVEYS

West Allis-West Milwaukee Schools will notify parents and obtain consent or allow parents to opt their child out of participating in certain school surveys and classroom activities. Parents also have the right to view the survey and materials. These include a student survey, analysis, or evaluation that concerns one or more of the following eight areas related to the student or student's family:

1. Political affiliations or beliefs;
2. Mental or psychological issues;
3. Sex behavior or attitudes;
4. Illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, or demeaning behavior;
5. Critical appraisals of others with whom respondents have close family relationships;
6. Legally recognized privileged relationships, such as with lawyers, doctors, or ministers;
7. Religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs;
8. Income, other than as required by law to determine program eligibility.

Any survey, activity or curriculum materials dealing with these topics are to be reviewed by the building principal and the School Board is to be informed prior to their use.
